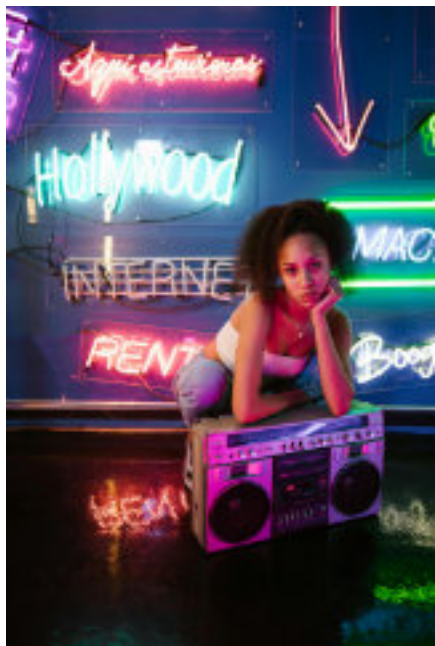

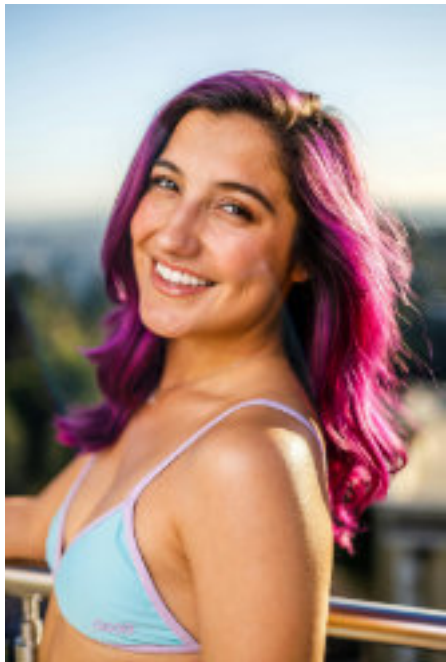
In addition to her acting career, Watson is a passionate advocate for women's rights. Her work as a UN Women Goodwill Ambassador has brought attention to issues of gender
